Parish Letter— March 2024

Dear All

We are a little way into Lent already and I wonder how it is going for you? Have you given something up, such as sugar, alcohol, meat etc, and have you managed to stick to it or have you wobbled along the way? Maybe you have committed yourself to some additional spiritual reading or prayers instead; how is that coming along I wonder?



Lent doesn't have to be a time of privation. It's a time when we are encouraged to explore our faith and, as we retrace Christ's journey to the cross, resurrection and our ultimate salvation, a time to remind ourselves of the extent of God's love for us. If love is a central theme of Lent therefore, then surely it is more feast-like than fast-like, a joyful thing and something to be celebrated.

Writing in 2017, Pope Francis offered some alternatives to our traditional Lenten ways of fasting or feasting that are both challenging and inspiring. Instead of abstaining from food or other habits, he suggested that we give up unkind or unloving words and behaviours. If we can give these things up then we will find ourselves provided with a feast of a different kind, a spiritual feast that is rooted in love.

These are what he suggested:

- 1. Fast from hurtful or mean words and instead speak only kindness.
- 2. Fast from sadness and instead be filled with gratitude.
- 3. Fast from anger and be filled with patience.
- 4. Fast from pessimism and be filled with hope.
- 5. Fast from worries and trust in God.
- 6. Fast from complaining and contemplate simplicity.
- 7. Fast from pressure and be more prayerful.
- 8. Fast from bitterness and fill our hearts with joy.
- 9. Fast from selfishness and become compassionate to others.
- 10. Fast from grudges and be reconciled.
- 11. Fast from words and be silent so we can listen.

Fasting from negativity and feasting on the positivity can be a challenging idea. For some reason, focusing on the negative in our own and others' lives seems to come so much easier than choosing to look for the good in everything. Yet surely to do so can only have a positive effect, not only on our own mindset and outlook but also on friends, family and neighbours' experiences of us as well.

We know what an amazing village we live in, full of empathetic people who appreciate the Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty we are lucky enough to be amongst, but how good it is to know that good parenting is making itself felt in the outstanding initiative of a family living on Pebble Hill.



Last week, 12-year-old Riley Cobbold came home from school having learnt of the plight of the only two remaining northern white rhinos in captivity. She felt quite bereft and knew that it was no good just feeling bad, she had to do something to help. She and her parents, Rich and Benji her brother, put their heads together and a few days later after a lot of hard work and much baking, they set up a stall on the North Downs Way, overlooking

the kiln. The stall was filled with homemade lemonade, cakes of every sort


and, more importantly, they had a Just Giving page set up, so any random hikers who had no cash, could make a donation that way. They were helped by a group of school friends from Dorking and the surrounding villages, including Jess Edwards, who lives on Pebble Hill.



Luck was on their side, as the day they chose was the date of a run over the North Downs Way, so all afternoon the stall was busy, with villagers, and runners, queuing for lemonade and cakes. The Rise and Fall of Napoleon Bonaparte

Illustrated with many wonderful works of art, this lecture tells the extraordinary story of the rise of the son of a lawyer in Ajaccio, Corsica, to become Emperor of the French before finally being defeated and sent into exile on the island of Saint Helena in the South Atlantic. It also attempts to explain the nature of his genius as an administrator and a military commander, assessing his achievements and his failures, his strengths and his weaknesses. Among the topics covered will be his marriage to Josephine de Beauharnais, his relationship with the Duke of Wellington, and his place within history. It is in some ways a very human story, but one which focuses on one of the most remarkable men who has ever lived.



March sees the first concert of this year's Leith Hill Music Festival, a performance of Bach's great masterpiece the *St Matthew Passion*. This large-scale choral work, telling the story of Jesus's betrayal, trials and crucifixion, will be performed by a large choir of Leith Hill singers and an outstanding group of soloists, with the excellent professional baroque orchestra Canzona. The concert will be conducted by Jonathan Willcocks, now in his final year as conductor of the Leith Hill Festival. The competitions and concerts of the main festival will follow in April.

The Dorking Concertgoers present the third and final concert in their string quartet series, this time with the Jubilee quartet. Alongside an early Haydn quartet, their programme includes three Czech works - Janáček's very personal second quartet (*Intimate letters*), a selection from Dvořák's set of short pieces *Cypresses*, and the *Coventry meditation* by Vilem Tausky, written to commemorate the destruction of that city in the Second World War.

The Dorking Philharmonia's concert includes two familiar works – Beethoven's fourth symphony and Rodrigo's lively and melodious guitar concerto – along with the first performance of a new piece, *Lichen on Bricks*, by the orchestra's own conductor, Paul Newbold.

Brockham choral society will perform Verdi's monumental Requiem. This intense and moving, highly dramatic setting of the Latin Requiem text, with its powerful choruses, large orchestra and soloists, is undoubtedly a peak of the choral repertoire. Conducted by Cole Bendall, the choir will be joined by the British Sinfonietta and four solo singers.

Dorking Halls has a live relay from the Royal Opera House of Puccini's Madam Butterfly, followed by a repeat screening a few days later. The opera tells the story of a young Japanese girl who is betrayed by the American naval officer she marries, with Puccini's beautiful but heart-rending music.
